During this period of new innovative medical education principles and practices, the deanery was so open minded and enthusiastic to get all these concepts up and running, and insistent to adamant that this is the way the faculty of medicine Gezira University should pursue by continuous consultation with the faculty staff, by staff involvement, and through visits to outside similar institutions. Very soon after that the community oriented Universities network was established and the Gezira was one of the leaders. Within this healthy environment I found the golden chance of attending a big number of medical education workshops and conferences inside and outside the country. This has put people in the right track and the faculty became a pioneer in this type of medical education, and the traditional opponents of yesterday became proponents of today. The end result has been that, the majority of the country's medical schools are now adopting the same innovative locally made to fit our country needs and system of medical education.

2, Activities within the Hospital Wad – Medani Teaching Hospital

Wad-Medani Teaching Hospital contains over 1000 beds. It is a very busy hospital, situated in a confluence of highway roads. My unit consisted of 24 beds with an extra four to six beds allotted for emergency cases. The unit was staffed with two house Officers, two registrars. The duty rota was one in five. The unit activities consisted of one general referred outpatient clinic, one special mycetoma clinic, one portal hypertension clinic, one and a half day for elective surgical operations, one cutaneous leishmaniasis clinic simultaneously run with the Dermatologist and one day for upper and lower gastrointestinal endoscopy.

Within the Hospital, I was: A member of the Board of Directors, Member of the Hospital Steering Committee, Chairman of the Instruments and Equipment Supply Committee as well as playing a very active role in the training of Junior Doctors and Paramedical Staff in the region.

The Royal Commission Medical Center – Yanbu, a twin sister of the previous Royal Commission hospital Al-Fanateer hospital. The medical center in Yanbu was also a highly equipped center that serves the population of Yanbu Industrial City (population 25,000) and the surrounding catchments area. The department was staffed with 3-4 General Surgeons, two Orthopedic Surgeons, one Urologist, two ENT Surgeon, and one Ophthalmologist and, one Pediatric Surgeon and four Residents, man the department of Surgery. The duty rota was one in three. There were four outpatients clinics for every surgeon and two operating sessions. Road traffic accidents and Industrial Accidents constituted a big load of emergency work.

Apart from the general and Laparoscopic work, the job invited an Active Post Graduate & Continuous Medical Education Program. I chaired this department as well as I used to oversee the entire Departments' Academic and Educational Activities.

As part of the local academic activities utilizing the available manpower and other facilities, I established a monthly journal named Medical and Health Management Journal, which was registered in the index medicus but unfortunately did not survive much after I left the hospital.

5. Activities within the North West Armed Forces Hospital (NWAFFH) – Tabuk, KSA. 1996 - 2004

The NWAFFH is a modern well-equipped facility serving the military population of the northwest region as well as the surrounding catchment's area. It provides primary, secondary and tertiary care to the region. The department of surgery consisted of all the surgical subspecialties including general and laparoscopic surgery, neurosurgery, cardiothoracic surgery, plastic and reconstructive surgery, urology, and orthopedics and maxillofacial surgery. The department ran an active postgraduate training program for the residents and a postgraduate basic and advanced laparoscopic surgery course in association with the Royal College of Surgeon in Ireland. Within this academic and active service set up, I used to run three weekly busy clinics, two operating sessions a week for post graduate students and residents. I was the Chairman of the Trauma Team Committee, the Surgical Department representative in the Disaster Control Committee, the QA & I Committee, as well as been the coordinator of the postgraduate surgical residents training program.

During my time this institution was operated and managed by the RCSI, the place was akin to an academic institution or even a university, the academic activities were many and rife, as well as the conferences, the workshops and the meetings, all the RCSI examinations were run in this hospital, in medicine, surgery, pediatrics, obstetrics and gynecology, epidemiology and basic statistics and quality improvement activities.

All the surgical subspecialties are represented in the department namely general surgery, laparoscopy, orthopedics, urology, plastic, ENT, pediatric surgery, transplant and vascular surgery. The General Surgery section provides state-of-the-art service in all the various divisions namely oncology surgery, upper GIT, endocrine surgery, colorectal surgery, Hepato Biliary, and laparoscopic surgery. It receives referrals from all over the country for tertiary care cases. The service is provided by well-trained consultant surgeons, registrars and residents. The department is recognized by the Saudi Council for Health Specialties for the training of surgical residents at all levels of training from R1 to R5. The department has 13 residents in training and grossly involved in teaching, training and research. Within this rich set up, I run an active service in the field of upper GI and endocrine surgery electively and whatever comes from the ER. The on Call roster runs on a one in four basis. Other activities include:
