- The English word "ethics" is derived from the Ancient Greek meaning "relating to one's character", which itself comes from the root word meaning "character, moral(principals of right and wrong Behaviour) nature"

Simply stated, ethics refers to standards of behaviour that tell us how human beings ought to act in the many situations in which they find themselves-as friends, parents, children, citizens, businesspeople, teachers, professionals, and so on.

- Ethics seeks to resolve questions of human morality by defining concepts such as good and evil, right and wrong, virtue and vice, justice and crime.
- As a field of intellectual inquiry, moral philosophy also is related to the fields of moral psychology, descriptive ethics, and value theory.

- **Ethics** or **moral philosophy** is a branch of philosophy that involves systematizing, defending, and recommending concepts of right and wrong conduct.
- The field of ethics concern matters of value, and thus comprise the branch of philosophy called axiology ([the study of nature of value](#)).
